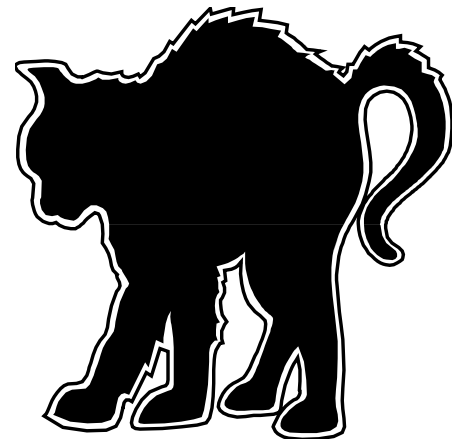

1. Provide a variety of treats by 6:15pm the night of our meetings. Remember to provide a variety (sweets, nuts, fruit, cheeses, vegetables etc.). Some members cannot eat sweets.
2. Set up counter with treats and beverages.
3. Guild will provide coffee, tea bags and hot water for tea. If other beverages are wanted, the hostesses can choose to provide other items: juice, soda, cider, iced tea. **Christy will provide the ice and water.**
4. A seasonal runner or decoration always adds a little festivity.
5. The coordinator will make sure that enough plates, napkins, plastic ware, and hot/cold cups are available. If the hostesses want a seasonal theme, please make arrangements among yourselves to furnish the necessary items. Note: extras cannot be left in the black box.
6. Clean up after the meeting is over:
 - ◆ Empty coffee pots, wash out, and put in basket.
(Christy will take them home.)
 - ◆ Put all general materials back in the black box and close it.
The black box is stored in the main room east of the piano.
 - ◆ List any items needed and give to the coordinator.
 - ◆ Make sure no food items are left behind.
 - ◆ Carefully wash all counter tops used by the guild and rinse the sinks.
We do not want to leave any trace of our being there.

Want to Make a Little Zippered Bag OR a Microwave Potholder?



Helen Vigansky will be teaching anyone who wants to make either project at our November 3 meeting.

Supplies for zippered bag: 2 – 10 inch x 12 inch pieces of fabric (fat quarters work well), one will be the outside of the bag and the other the lining, 14 inch nylon zipper to match fabric, Pellon lightweight fusible fleece – code 987F, thread to match fabric, 12 inches of elastic cording and a large button. Serenity Quilt Shop has all the supplies except button. Hobby Lobby has a nice selection of large buttons.

Sewing machine in good working order, zipper foot and zigzag foot for sewing machine, sharp point scissors, marking pencil 6 inch ruler and pins.

To prepare for class, press fusible fleece to back side of fabric that will be the outside. Layer outside fabric with lining fabric, wrong sides together. Quilt as desired. Or you can use fabric that is already quilted.

Supplies for Microwave Potholder

- 2 - 10 inch squares of cotton fabric
- 2 - 10 inch squares of cotton batting

Cotton thread to match, marking pens, cutting mat at least 12 inches square and ruler at least 16 inches long, sewing machine in good working order, scissors, pins, etc.
