Date: Tuesday, April 9, 2024.



Secretary Lemon Blueberry Trifle Cut cake into 1" cubes 1 9x13 lemon cake, baked and cooled Layer ingredients in a glass bowl, in the 2 boxes instant lemon pudding mix, per package following order: instructions cake cubes, with a few blueberries 16 oz cool whip topping lemon curd .5 c Lemon curd pudding cookie crumbs .5 c crushed shortbread cookies 1 C fresh blueberries (and a few for garnish) blue berries Zest of 1 lemon, lemon slices to garnish cool whip Layer a second time. Refrigerate at least 2 hours (or overnight). Garnish with lemon zest, Up to 1 day before: bake cake, allow to cool blueberries, lemon slices completely. Mix pudding, let set.
