But what I've also realized is that I like having UFOs just hanging around my sewing space. I'm a sewer who likes to sew, no matter what it is, and am inspired to sew based on how I feel. If I tire of the color palette I'm working on, I can always rummage around and find something else to work on. Christmas fabrics in July? Absolutely! And patriotic colors in January? You bet!



Shopping for Quilt supplies

What is your favorite sewing aid that does not come from a craft, fabric, or quilt store? I find useful items at hardware stores, grocery stores and office supply stores. Here are some of the items I use from hardware stores. They are less expensive, leaving more cash for fabric!

Insulation foam sheet (comes in 8ft x 4ft): for a design wall, very light and portable. It works great covered in muslin or large gingham for a natural 1 inch grid.

T Square or corner square: for checking corners and making sure seams are straight over distances of 4 feet or more

Painters tape (everyone's favorite): to mark straight line quilting. It also makes a great de-linter rolled sticky side out around your hand.

Cheap brushes: to clean out my sewing machine, brush off threads from the quilt top and to pick up lint.

Rubber Gardening gloves: for moving quilts under the presser foot.

Chalk line, chalk: temporarily marking quilt lines and checking alignment

Plastic sheets: both hard and soft for pattern making

Paper rolls used as drop cloths for pattern making

Large washers: for holding down pattern pieces or cutting corners or round applique pieces.
