

Even though I've gotten organized I'm not yet ready to start a large project, I've had an itching to start on my Guild contribution item. Remember when there were craft fairs? Well-one day they will be back & I'm getting a jump start and make mine this month. Did you know that each SPQ guild member is asked to contribute a handmade quilted item or item(s) made from fabric that can be sold at the Guild's primary fundraiser- holiday craft fairs? Join me as I go down the rabbit hole.

Craft Fair Ideas:

Small, practical gifts for quilting friends, relatives, or anyone that enjoy textiles! Many people still buy for themselves when 'shopping for others'. Quality, unique & well-constructed items created in trendy fabrics will be certain to catch an eye! Items in the \$5-\$25 range tend to move the quickest but that's not to say items with higher value will not sell.

Do I hear someone asking- Where can I get inspiration and ideas?

Many websites have wonderful free or for sale patterns, share patterns/books with a friend, or browse websites for ideas and/or tutorials. For instance, look through November/December quilting, craft & cooking magazines, flip through some home catalogs and see what popular colors & items are being displayed, check Etsy.com to see what others are making, and also when you are Zooming, Snapchatting or Tik Toking with your friends or family ask them if they've seen anything "cool" to jump start your creative juices.

The guild guidelines state "quilted" items, but don't limit your thoughts to just quilts-expand the horizons - we have knitters, crocheters, embroiderers, scrap bookers, jewelry makers, punch needlers & stitchers amongst us. Handmade items are desired, used and purchased by all.

According to Martha Stewart.com "No matter what kind of needlework is your chosen hobby, a good project bag can work wonders for your stitching game. Not only does one allow you to keep your supplies handy and organized, but you can also take it with you wherever you go."

Who wouldn't want a cute project bag to show off?

Some suggestions (if you come up with additional fabulous ideas- please share with members)

Sewing aids: scissor cases, needle/thread caddies, zippered bags/pouches, quilting/knitting/crochet/embroidery project bags, drawstring pouches, pincushions

Ideas for children: baby quilts, bibs, burp cloths, pillowcases, pencil pouches

Ideas for Adults: scarves, cell phone carriers, coasters, placemats, face masks

One more thing, "normal" craft shows we attend are often in the fall/winter/holiday season- which means gift items are super popular and people are looking for them ie. wall hangings, table runners, ornaments, stockings, tree skirts, oven mitts, table toppers, etc.

The Guild is also in need of 2 or more volunteers to shadow Kitty Plovanich, current craft show chair. The Craft Show Chair position involves a lot for one person, therefore, we'd like to adjust the duties to a committee of 2 or more who will oversee the craft shows we participate in (post Covid) If you can volunteer, please let Lori or Jane know. 
