After doing some research, I found some ideas from Court Senior Creative to help get out of a creative slump.

1: Take a break. Creative brains need rest! Set a timeframe to step away from your work and don't feel guilty about it.

2: Assess your state of mind. When it comes to unravelling your creativity, being in the right state of mind is essential. Some of us use creativity as an opportunity to escape negative thoughts while others express their melancholic emotions through art. The key is identifying which state of •

mind makes you most productive.

3: Seek out inspiration. The artist community is full of inspiration that can help get your creative juices flowing.

4: Shift your focus. Try something else. You could try a completely different color palette, medium, or even subject matter. Or you could take up a new creative endeavor altogether like pottery, photography, woodworking. Giving your brain the opportunity to concentrate on a new task will help stimulate your creative motivation and mojo, while also helping you get back into the flow state, we all know and love.

I hope your creative slumps are short lived! Onward...


